#### Declaration of Protective Covenants

# BENT TREE IV and V

#### KNOW ALL MBN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That whereas the Declarant, Arrowwood Development Corporation, hereloader called Declarant, is the owner of Tracts One Hundred Ninety-soven (197) through Two Hundred Pilty seven (257), BBNT TREE, Filing's IV and V (hereinafter BENT TREE), situate in the County of El Paso and State of Colorado. ("Tracts" may be referred to as "tots" in these covenants and on the plat, and if so, these terms are interchangeable.)

NOW THERBFORB, in consideration of the acceptance hereof by the several purchasers and grantees (fils, her, their or its helir, excenters, administrators, personal representatives, successors and asrigns, and all persons or concerns claiming by, through or under such grantees) of deeds to lots in said tract of land, said Declarant bereby declares to and agrees with each and every person who shall be or shall become owner of any of said lots, in addition to the ordinances of the County of El Paso, Colorado, that they shall be and are hereby bound by the covenants set forth in these presents and the defications, restrictions, easements, and notes on the presents and the defications, restrictions, casements, and notes on the said lots, the property described in these restrictions shall be held and enjoyed subject to and with the beafit and advantage of the following restrictions, limitations, conditions and agreements, to with

- 1. INTENT: The intent of these covenants is to preserve BENT TRIES as an exclusive, high quality residential area of lacking value, and the covenants have been designed to that end. Property owners in BENT TRES abould be people who value quality, who will respect, uphold and observe the letter, spirit and intent of these covenants, and who will indist upon their strict enforcement. The intent of these covenants also applies to real estate agents and builders involved in selling Bent Tree properties and building homes for tale or for owners.
- 2. BUILDING TYPE AND USE: All tracts shall be known and described as residential tracts and shall be used only for custombuilt self-dential homes and country custes. No structure shall be creeted, altered, converted, placed or permitted to rumain on any tract other than one single-farnly dwelling not to exceed two and one-half (2 1/2) stories in beight, a private garage, and guest house or servants quarters, all in keeping with the urchitecture, style, him details and construction materials of the principal residence, provided that such are not used for any commercial purpose, and subject to approval by the Architectural Control Committee, hereinafter referred to as ACC, and the appropriate governmental building department. No structure may be erected prior to construction of the main dwelling. BENT TREE is intended only for custom-built homes of harmonious design to complement the natural terrain and other homes econstructed in the studyistion. No modile homes, premanufactured homes with the appearance of mobile homes or "doublewides", or dones shall be approved,
- 3. <u>DWELLING SIZE</u>: The minimum size of the dwellings is not the only criteria used in the decision to approve or disapprove plans. Plans which must the minimum size requirement may be disapproved based on other criteria: The size of the dwelling is established primarily to reflect the Declarant's latent regarding the quality of the BENT TREE development and to maintain property values for all resident in Bent Tree. Recognizing that size is not necessarily indicative of the quality the ACC may grant reasonable requests for variances to size criteria or give credit for special construction amendities when, in its opinion, such variances and credits enhance the quality and compatibility of the structure and the BENT TREE development.

The finished enclosed living area of the main dwelling structure exclusive of garages and porches shall not be less than 2500 square feet for a one-story dwelling. For a dwelling of more than one-story, the ground floor finished living area shall not be less than 1850 square feet, and not less than 3000 square feet total, allowing for finished living area on the upper floors added to the main living area. Homes with basement windows above ground level and houses with garden/tennee/basement entrances on one side vill normally be considered as one-stary homes for the purposes of this covenant. In its sole discretion, the ACC may treat a b-level as a single or intidistory building depending upon its appearance, size, location and amount of finished interior space. Attached garages are required for all houses, shall be of size to accommodate not less than three foll-ized cars, and doors shall be first closed. All garage doors shall be equipped with

automatic remote control openers. No carport or other open, unepclosed structure intended as a storage or parking for vehicles shall be constructed or used on any trad. Gárages thall be required to open either to the side or rear of a house. Automobiles and small boats will not habitually be parked overnight ostaide of garages.

- 4. <u>BUILDING LOCATION</u>: When the house plans are sobritted, there shall be submitted to the ACC a separate piot plan showing the planned location of all improvements contemplated upon the lot, and the ACC may alter the site location or deny construction if, in the opinion of the ACC, the proposed site location would unduly interfere with adjoining lots at to view, protinity of construction, the natural growth or terrain, or cause other potential interference with existing or proposed construction on adjoining lots. Buildings should be located on lots in such a way as to minimize damage to existing foliage and natural growth. No trees may be removed other than under the provisions of Paregraph 10 hereof, and the lots shall be maintained in their natural state as nearly as possible, except that a reasonably sized lawn and garden, not to exceed two thousand (2000) equare fett may be planted around the house.
- A. Setbacks: No building shall be erected, placed or altered on any lot searer than alnoty (90) feet to any lot line fronting a road, nor mearer than thirty-five (35) feet to any other lot line. Fences, if any, along any lot line fronting a road shall be set back a minimum of fifteen (15) feet from said lot line. Exceptions to the setback requirements are sometimes logical and may be made by the ACC in cases where extensating circumstances exist, provided however, that any such acceptions must be requested in writing and granted by the ACC in writing. For the purposes of this covenant, eaves, steps and open purches shall be considered as part of the building. (See Notes and Setbacks on recorded plat.) Declarant and/or Architectural Control Committee may designate additional setbacks and/or designate no build areas on lots to protect views of the mountains for adjacent tracts, which views in their solo discretion they deem reasonable; however, they do not have the obligation to do so.
- TEMPORARY RESIDENCES: No structure of temporary character, trailer, batement, tent or accessory building shall be need on any lot as a residence, temporarily or permanently.
- TIME OF CONSTRUCTION AND BUILDERS COMPLIANCE FEE: No construction shall be permitted upon any lot until Declarant has been paid in full for said lot (see also the provisions in Declarant's Deed of Trust).

Once construction shall have been initiated on any structure, including walls, feaces, residences, anciliary buildings or any other structure, which has been previously approved by the ACC, construction of that particular structure, including landscaping, shall be completed within nine (9) months of the time such construction was initiated. The ACC may extend the time for complication under unostal circumstances, and any such time extension shall be in writing. In no event, other than inclement weather, shall fine/final grading and clean up (debris, shumps, limbs, left over building items, see.) be delayed more than 30 days after completion of a borne. A refundable builders compliance les, in an amount set by the ACC, shall be paid to the ACC at time of approval of house plans and shall be refunded upon satisfactory completion of the dwelling structure and compliance with the clean up and final grading provisions of this paragraph.

If any structure be abandoned, Declarant and/or the ACC shall have the authority to remove or complete all or portions of such structures so as to prevent its being unsightly and a detriment to the area. Notice of intent to remove or complete will be nucled to the owner at his last known address, and shall be posted on the lot ten (10) days prior to such action and, in the event that such removal becomes necessary, the owner of the lot shall be liable for all costs of such work, which costs shall constitute a lien which shall be recorded against said property, and shall be due and poyable immediately and bear interest at the rate of eighteen percent (18%) per annum or two percent (2%) above the prime rate of the Norwest Bank of Colorado Springs, N.A., whichever is higher, until paid.

7. PROPERTY OWNERS' ASSOCIATION: Lot owners in BENT TREE IV and V shall automatically become members of the "Bent Tree Property Owners' Association" (BTPOA) which membership also includes all lot owners in Bent Tree subdivisions I, II, & III; said membership is mandatory and is a condition of purchasing their lot(s). Dues shall be required in accordance with the By-laws thereof which owners agree to pay promptly when due. This Association shall operate as a non-profit corporation for all Bent Tree fillings, according to the provisions of its Articles of incorporation and By-laws. Eac's tract shall have one vote. Remaining original inventory tracts or repostessed tracts owned by Declarain, its soccessors or assiges, shall not be assessable, but shall carry one vote each. The BTPOA is responsible for administering (the plans for augmenta-

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tion as more fully described in Paragraph 8.

The property owners' association shall have a lien against all tracts the owners of which are delinquent, for non-payment of dues, late feet, and assessments levied by the property owners' association, where such dues, late fees, and assessments are in amount by thirty (30) days or more. The property owners' association is empowered to file such lien with the El Paso County Clerk and Recorder, and such lien shall run with the land; provided, however, that if each tract is repostessed by Deckrant, its successors or assigns, the lieu shall become null and void and shall be hereby released at that time. Continued failure to pay such liens may result in foreclassure on the entire property/tract in order to enforce payment.

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# WATER AUGMENTATION PLAN REQUIREMENTS:

- A. Lots 233 through 251 in BENT TREE shall be subject to the decree for the Northgase Co. augmentation plan entered by the District Court for Water Division No. 2 In Case Nos. 82CW370 (Water Division No. 1) and 82CW180 (Water Division No. 2), (the "oxiginal augmentation plan"), (Recorded at Reception No. 098163645 of the records of the Clerk and Recorder of El Paso County, Colorado). Lots 197 through Clerk and Restract of El Fast County, Contrator, Los 17 Justing 222 in Birth TREII shall be subject to the decree for the Northgale Co. augmentation plan entered by the District Court for Water Division No. 2 controllidated Case Nos. 96CW134 (Water Division No. 2) and 96CW225 (Water Division No. 1) (the "supplemental augmentation plan"). (Recorded El Paso Connty 5/8/98 Reception No. 098061311).
- B. Each owner shall be responsible for obtaining a permit for a well to provide a water supply to his dwelling and for contracting and operating such well. Well permits for each lot must be submitted to the Division of Water Resources, Office of the State Engineer for approval. Normally well drilling companies furnish the required well application form, assiel in its properation and can provide information on types of casing, pumps, etc. Lot owners may coaled a ground water consultant of examp, pumps, etc. Los owners may conasci a grotton water consultant of their choice for specific recommendations as to depth, easing, casing diameter and pumping equipment. All wells shall be constructed and operated in compliance with the applicable augmentation pian and the pormits for such wells. Each owner will submit to the Beni Tree Property Owners Association a copy of the complicated well log made by the well driller, so as to provide information necessary to the augmentation plans,
- C. Pursuant to the original augmentation plan, eleven (11) a swimming pools are permitted in BENT TREB, all filings. Tract owners shall make written application to Declarant or ACC, if applicable, for a permit to construct a swimming pool, designating the dize, the amount of water to be impointed and the date of construction. On a first-corre, first served basis, Declarant shall review the submission and approve or disapprove the gool. Construction of an approved pool must be commenced within nine (9) months of approval and most be completed within twelve (12) months. Approvats shall automatically expire one (1) year from the date thereof. Each pool must be individually metered to enable samual determination of the actual number of gallons of water used. After approval and construction of eleven (11) swimming pools, the ACC shall deny any further applications, unless and until an amended augmentation plan is approved allowing the construction of more than eleven (11) pools. No swimming pools are provided for on Lois 197 through 232.
- D. The Declarant is hereby authorized to administer and enforce, or to contract for administration and enforcement of, the augmentation plans for BENT TREE under the terms of said plans and shall be retion pans for BERN IKER upoer the terms of said plant and shall be relimbursed by the BTPOA for the costs thereof. Among other things, the decree requires that an annual survey be made of the actual linguisted acreage upon each lot in BBNT TREE, as permitted in paragraph 4, hereof, and that annual reports be made to the Division Engineers of Water Division. sions I and 2. Each owner shall provide to the appropriate administering authority the information necessary to enable the reports to be filed in a timely manner.
- E. Declarant has assigned to the BTPOA its rights and responsibilities under the original augmentation plan in the Assignment of Rights and Responsibilities Under Plan for Augmentation Decree (1984 Decree) recorded at Reception No. 099004296 of the records of the Clerk and Recorder of El Paso County, Colorado, and under the the Clerk and Recorder at M 1250 County, Colorado, and under the supplemental augmentation plan in the Assignment of Rights and Responsibilities Under Pian for Augmentation Decree (1998 Decree) recorded at Reception No. 099084297 of the records of the Clerk and Proceedings of the Clerk and Proceedings of the Clerk and the Northwest of the Northwest of the Clerk and the Northwest of the Nor Recorder of El Paso County, Colorado. Declarant and the Northgate Company, in the Agreement recorded at Reception No. 099004295 of the records of the Clerk and Recorder of El Paso County, Colorado, also have reserved 933 acre-feet of Laramie Fox Bills Aquifer ground water decreed by the District Court for Water Division No. 1 in Case Nos. 82CW295 and 87CW193 to be used by the BTPOA for replacing post-pumping depictions under the supplemental augmentation plan. The DTPOA shall be responsible for all costs associated with drilling. equipping, operating and maintaining any well or wells, ead associated

infrastructure that may be required to deliver the reserved ground water to the Arkansas River and South Platte River Basins. Such Assignments and Agreement are to provide a water supply sufficient for the operation of the wells for BENT TREE under the augmentation plans. Under the Assignments and Agreement, the BTPOA holds such interest to the augmentation plans and the augmentation water supplies for the benefit of all lol owners. Declarant shall assign to the BTPOA for the occurs of an ion owners. Declarant shall assign to the BTPOA any contract that Declarant bus entered into providing for the administration or enforcement of the augmentation phase or the operation of the augmentation water supply, and the BTPOA shall be obligated to accept same. The BTPOA shall assume responsibility for administering and enforcing the augmentation plans, and shall take all necessary actions to insure protection of water and well rights for all lot owners pursuant to the augmentation plans, including pursulag and maintain-leg all further actions required under the augmentation plans.

F. Augmentation Well(t). Two sugmentation wells have been drilled, one in the area sext to the Fire Station in Filing IV and one on the lot line between Lots 158 and 159 in Filing III. These wells augment both lot line between Lots 158 and 159 in Filing III. These wells augment both the Plant and Arkansas drainages providing the basis for the State Engineer grading individual Dawson Aquifer wells to all lots in Beat Tree studyrision. Perrions of the water rights from these wells have been deeded to the Beot Tree Property Owner's Association (BTPOA) by Special Warranty Deed recorded at Recaption Nos. 099001540 and 099001542 of the records of the Clerk and Recorder of El Paso County, Colorado, to assure continuing authorization by the State Engineer for individual lot owners to use water from their wells. Necessary easements for the maintenance of these wells are as shown on the recorded plats and as reserved in these covedants.

The BTPOA is tasked with administration and enforcement of the water augmentation plans for Bent Tree. For that reason as well as the many benefits a property owner's association can provide, every let owner must belong to the BTPOA with its concomitant Spancial obligations and participate as a cohedyn group. Membership is not optional, it is obligatory and runs with the land.

- (1) BTFOA and Lot Owner Responsibilities. The owners of all lots in all filings of Beni Tree comprise the BTFOA. Said Individual lot owners and the BTFOA are responsible for carrying out the requirelot owners and the HIPOA are responsible for carrying out the requirements of the water augmentation decrees, including the possible replacement of post pumping depictions from the subject wells, including all costs associated with drilling, equipping, operating, and maintaining any well or wells, and associated infrastructure, that may be required to deliver the reserved ground water to the Arkaness River and South Pinto River Basins. - (2) Annul Inventory. Special rules apply to 36 lots in Filing 4, Lots 197 through 232 Inclusive, under the supplemental augmentafring 4, total 197 integral extractives, and of the supplemental augmented from plan. The BTPOA shall complete an annual inventory of homes on the lots above described, and the total area of turf grass or equivalent vegetation being irrigated. There are other required actions as spelled out in the aforesaid Augmentation Plans which provide a complete description of the atorsing Augmentation Flans which provides a Said Augmentation Plans State Engineer's requirements of all lot owners. Said Augmentation Plans are of public record in El Paso County and shall by made available to all property owners in Bent Tree.
- O. No changes or deletions to this Paragraph 8 may be made which may alter or in any manner compromise the water augmentation plans or the water rights of either Declarant or DTFOA or the BENT TREB lot owners, except by order of the applicable Water Court.
- H. Water Mejera with an accessible extenior read-out shall be required on each water well installed on Lots 197 through 232. It is the responsibility of such well owners to read their meters and submit amount of water used in form and frequency (normally amountly) in compliance with the supplemental augmentation plan.
- I. Declarant, its successors and assigns, at the time of lot sales, shall convey to individual led owners sufficient water rights in the Dawson Aquifer underlying each lot to sailsfy El Paso County's 300 year water supply requirement, and to enable individual lot owners to obtain well permits from the State Engineer. For Bent Tree IV, that amount shall be as follows: for Loss 233-251, 0.404 acre-feet per year for a 300 year supply (for lots with swimming pools, the amount shall tor a 300 year supply (no too mile year supply); for lots 197-232, be 0.449 acre-feel por year for a 360 year supply); for lots 197-232, 0.383 acre-feel per year for a 300 year supply. For Beul Tree Y, the 300 year water supply requirement does not apply, and the conveyed amount shall be 0.404 acre-feet per year.
- DRAINAGE DETENTION: On some loss within Bent Tree IV and V drainage considerations mandated construction of small terrace like

basins to slow water runoff onto adjacent properties. These detention structures are shown on the recorded plats of Bent Tree IV and V. In addition, dischouts along the side disches of the stabilition roads are constructed to carry water away from the roads. Such detention structures and dischouts will not be altered or changed by any lot owners. Further, maintenance of said drainage and water runoff control facilities are the responsibility of the Bent Tree Property Owner's Association (BTPOA) in cooperation with the owners of lots on which the detention structures exist. Perpental easements exist for the BTPOA to eater upon such lots to effect maintenance of ead structures. The BTPOA to later upon such lots to effect maintenance of ead structures. The BTPOA which represents all filings and lot owners in Bent Tree will be responsible for drainage muters within Bent Tree in compliance with requirements of the El Paso County Department of Transportation.

#### 10. ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL AND DESIGN:

A. <u>Purpose</u>: The purpose of this covenant is to assure through intelligent architectural control of building design, placement, matchile, colors and construction, that BENT TREB shall become and remain an attractive residential community, and to uphold and enhance property values. A freedom of architectural design is encouraged, so long at each dwelling design is harmony with the character of the developing community. Unconventional designs, inconsistent with this purpose, will not be permitted.

#### B. Architectural Control Committee (ACC):

(1) Composition: The ACC is composed of Declaran, its heirs, successors or assigns, represented by three (3) persons Isidally appointed by Declarant. After the completion of thirty-five (3.5) houses within the subdivision, Declarant may appoint one (1) member of the three-member ACC from among the owner-occupants of said homes to serve for three (3) years, after which that position shall be filled by an owner-occupant elected thereto by a simple majority vote of all the then owner-occupants (one vote per treed), to serve for three (3) years. Declarant may thereafter appoint a second owner-occupant ACC member of the three-member ACC for a similar initial term and subsequent election in a similar manner. Declarant or its representative shall terms on the ACC antil all lots have completed dwelling units thereon; however, at its option and chetice of time, Declarant may relinquish full control of the ACC to the owner-occupants, at which time all three (3) members shall be subject to election as provided herein.

Any elected member of the ACC whose performance is found objectionable by other owner-occupants may be removed by a vote of a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the then owner-occupants. In the event of the death or testignation of any elected member of the ACC, the remaining members thereof shall have full authority to designate a successor elected member to full the remaining term.

- (2) Liability of ACC: Neither Declarant, ACC, nor any persons aring therefor, shall be liable in damages to any person submitting requests for approval or to any lot owner by reason of any action, failure to act, approval, disapproval, or failure to such requests, or with regard to any other actions taken by the ACC under authorization of the provisions hereof, provided that they have acted in good faith and without negligence.
- (3) Records retained by ACC: The ACC shall maintain records of election of its members. It shall retain a complete file of applications, borne plans, and location sketches until all structures applied for thereunder have been completed and for five (5) years thereafter. If requests for additions are made, both the original plans and plans for said additions will be kept until said additions are completed.
- (4) <u>Compensation</u>: A non-refundable architectural review fee of one bunded dollars (\$100) shall be submitted along with each submitted of plans to the ACC to definy the administrative costs of the review process. Any musted portions thereof shall be deposited into the Enforcement Fund (see Paragraph 25.B.). No compensation other than resultancement of expenses, shall be received by members of the ACC for services performed pursuant to this covenant.

#### C. <u>Procedure for Obtaining Approval of Plans:</u>

- (1) Application and plans shall be submitted with review fee to Declarant.
- (2) If the owner believes that his plans may excounter serious objections, he should subralt preliminary drawings and/or a preliminary sketch and request, in writing, preliminary review prior to incurring the exposue of having detailed architectural working plans drawn. Such preliminary review shall not constitute final action. Resolution of any view concerns at purchaser might have should be resolved with Declarant prior to purchasing a loty once purchased such concerns shall be deemed satisfied.
- (3) Owner (not builder) shall make written application on a form provided by and obtained from Declarant or ACC, which shall be submitted with the following attachments:

- (a) One (i) copy of a site plan, drawn to scale, showing the exact location on the tract of all proposed improvements (house, well, sppic, leach field and other buildings even if only contemplated for the future). Exact proposed setbacks from lot lines must be delineated. Access routes (driveways) to proposed structures and any cleaning, plantage, ovaide lighting plans, or fencing must be included. Topographic maps showing terrain lines are recommended. (See also Paragraph 4.)
- (b) One (l) complete set of construction plans for building(s) detailing the floor plan, elevations, site location, and extentor building materials. Generally, garages most open to the nide or rest of the house away from the street. Gurage entrances, set at an angle to the main house on the street side, are permitted, if port of a well designed home, so long as the angle is not less than 30 degrees. Houses on corner lots shall comply with the above, at least on one street side.
- (c) Color samples and, if deemed necessary by the ACC, material samples of siding, roofing, etc.
- (d) A latter of commitment from a leader, guaranteeing approval of construction financing and/or permanent financing upon completion of construction, if and when requested by the ACC. Job specifications and price estimate (construction take-off sheet) for improvements intended may be required at the sole discretion of the ACC. The intent of this section is to ensure that the applicant is financially capable of completing the proposed improvements, thus reducing the possibility of an abandoned or partially finished structure on a lot.
- (c) A copy of the well permit application in the form to be submitted to the Office of the State Engineer.
- (4) ACC shall examine and consider plans, make field trips to the site (owner shall stake out the proposed location of buildings prior to submission of final plans), and approve or disapprove all submissions in writing. ACC shall return a copy of the submission form with its determination and comments, as appropriate. The set of plans, site plan and material/color samples shall be kept in the files of the ACC. The ACC may require the owner to make other submissions, to include material samples, prior to considering any application.

The ACC mry take up to thirty (30) days to approve or disapprove submissions, and, if disapproved, may take an additional thirty (30) days to consider any resubmitted plans. Normally, submissions will be resolved in less time, but owners should plan sufficiently in advance to give the ACC time to thoroughly examine plans, make on-site inspections and make well considered decisions. In the event that the ACC fails to approve or disapprove within thirty (30) days after receipt of any witner submission, or in any event, if no suit has been filed to enjoin the construction prior to its completion, approval shall soot be required, and the related covenants requiring ACC approval shall be deemed to have been fully compiled with, provided that all other covenants herein have been properly observed and compiled with. The foregoing notwithstanding, no plans shall be approved nor shall the above thirty (30) day automatic approval pertain, valess the owner is correct on his dues to the Bent Tree Property Owners' Association (BTPOA).

- (5) <u>Voting</u>: A sumple majority yoto (2/3) of the ACC shall determine supproval or disapproval; however, unless all three (3) members of the ACC have been given the opportunity to vote and all three (3) have signed the subtrainsion form, the approval or disapproval is not valid. The ACC will coordinate and work in concert with each other and report their decisions as a group and not individually.
- D. Authority of ACC. The ACC is empowered to approve or disapprove in variog all plans for construction, site locations, clearing, plansings, feecing, additions to ensisting structures, remodeling that alters the exterior, replacement of roofs, changing of house colors and any other changes in the natural environment of lots or appearance of homes in BBNT TREB. Disapproval of submissions by the ACC may be based on any grounds, including purely acathetic grounds. If such submissions are disapproved, the ACC shall give written reason for said disapproval to applicant. The ACC may make other reasonable requirements of the applicant, including, but not litrated to submission of additional plans, specifications, and material samples, and may require such changes as it deems necessary to conform to the overall intent as herein expressed.

The ACC shall have the right to alter site locations as shown on the subminds site plan, or deny construction if, in the opinion of the ACC, the proposed site locations will under interfere with adjoining lots as to view, laturations of sound or light, sanitation, proximity or type of construction, actual or proposed, or tackly damage the natural growth and terrain

The ACC may prohibit the construction of fences, houses or any other improvements to any lot, and is empowered to order their removal if written application was not made by the owner, if approval was not granted in accordance with these covenants, or if octual construction is different from the approved plans.

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The ACC, upon written request, shall have the authority to grant in writing, variances from the provisions of this Declaration of Protective Covenants as they apply to construction and sethetics, in cases of irregularly shaped lots, unusual terrain, highly desirable building sites near lot lines, or other conditions wherein the strict enforcement of these covenants would result in nausual hardship. The ACC shall be the cole and exclusive judge of whether or not such hardship exists. It is the intent of these declarations that the ACC shall exercise broad discretionary powers bereunder and its decisions shall be final and conclusive. The ACC shall resolve all questions of interpretation and these covenants shall be interpretated in accordance with their general purpose and intent as herrin expressed.

- E. Architectural Design and Requirements: In addition to the other requirements hereof, the following pertain:
- (1) Construction: No building, accessory building, streenure, walls, gates, bedges, fences, mailboxes, driveways, windireaks,
  swimming pools, flagpoles, windmills, pump houses, water tanks,
  exterior lighting or other improvements shall be communeed, erected, converted, placed, added to, maintained or altered on any lot until the construction place and specifications, to include design, height, material and color
  samples to be used, and a site plan showing the sexes location of the
  structure(s), have been approved by the ACC in writing as to quality of
  workmarship and materials, harmony of external design with existing structruc(s), location with respect to other structures planned, and as to topography and falshed grade elevation. This requirement applies both to new
  construction and to subsequent changes, additions, repainting and major
  tepairs or renovations. No construction of any such improvement shall be
  commenced until ACC approvals required by these covenants are obtained.
- (2) Facing Siding: To minimize fire propagation and hazards, facing and sidings of non-combutible materials are encouraged. This inclines the use of masonry construction (brick, stone, etteco, cultured stone, etc). Wood siding should be kept to a minimum but not exceeding 50% of the exterior area of the walls. Wood brim is permitted, but should be either covered with stucco, or kept to a minimum. Wood windows should be metal clad.
- (3) Roofing: Roof materials that are non-combustible or fire retarriant are the only ones permitted. This includes concrete tile, slate, certain type metal, and synthetic coment shingles with a shake appearance. On roofs with pitches of eight or twelve or greater, class "A" fire rated super heavyweight, triple laminated premium asphall shingles exceeding ASTM spec D 3462 such as O.C. Grand Masor, Celotax Presidential, Elk Premium Choice, etc. will be considered. Not permitted are lightweight or middleweight arphalt shingles on any roof pitch, cedar shakes, pine shakes or Masorate type wood shakes.

The <u>overhang</u> of the roof on reach style homes shall normally be at least twenty-four (24) inches.

- (4) Color. The colors of roofing, siding, and mim shall be coordinated and shall be organic in nature and be composible with the natural environment. No harsh or bright colors are permitted. Color samples must be submined with plans and application.
- (5) <u>Chimneys</u>: Spark arrestors small be required on all chimneys, and open fires in BENT TRES are prohibited.
- (6) Roof mounted solar collectors, skylights and other unusual or early conservation features should be custom designed and must be approved by the ACC. Roof mounted solar cellectors shall match the slope of the roof to which they are stanched.
- (7) Beergy features: Energy efficiency is encouraged through well scaled and insolated construction and the use of pursive solar design techniques. Solar collectors shall be located or acreemed to that reflections do not varies onably defeat the intent of these coverants to maintain a natural environment. Tall wind-powered electrical generators are prohibited.
- (8) Extrame designs: Homes of extreme design are not approved, it being the intent of these coverages to establish an area of quiet, unobtrusive dignity and quality consistent with other homes in BENT TREE.
- (9) <u>Materials</u>: All materials used in the construction, alteration or remodeling of any brilding shall be new and of good quality and design. Used materials of good quality may be used, provided they are first approved in writing by the ACC.
- (10) <u>Driveways</u>: In addition to obtaining approval from the ACC, pareleasers most obtain a written driveway permit from the El Paso County Department of Transportation prior to connection of any driveway to a public road. Owners of lots are advised that the County has no responsibility for and will not snowplow or otherwise maintain driveways whether on flag lots or other lots; such responsibility is solely that of the lot owner. Metal flared and extensions with additional store, rock, brick or

other masonry treatment are required on all driveway colverts, or else concrete on masonry headwalf to prevent bent and exposed ends of culvert pipes and a consequently unantnetive approach to a home. Plans submitted to the ACC must include the manner in which the driveway shall be constructed, and approval must be obtained from the ACC.

(11) <u>Mailboxes and their support structures</u>: Standardized mail baxes and support structures meeting postal requirements will be established by Declarant, to be installed by property owners in locations designated by Declarant and the U.S. Postal Department.

Homeowhere and or builders will provide support structures for homeowher's mushings, newspaper delivery, lighting, and property entrances with design and materials compatible with the dwelling design. These structures shall be located on either side of the driveway entrances and in from the street on the homeowhers property and not within the street easement.

Maintenance of the mailbox and post system in good, attractive painted (if appropriate) condition shall be the responsibility of the individual homeowners and the BTPOA shall pay half the transmalle cost of said maintenance, providing a cost projection to include materials, labor, etc. Is approved by the Architectural Control Committee prior to commencing work.

#### (12) Pences and Antennas:

- (a) <u>Feaces</u>. Feacing and hedges will be permitted but shall normally to no higher than six feet (6') and normally shall not extend beyond the front corner of the house. Consideration shall be given as to the types of feace in relation to the architectural design of the dwellings and the overall appearance in the community. Barbed wire feacing is probabled, and perimeter feaces and chain link normally will not be approved. Existing feacing on the boundary of BENT TREE shall not be removed, but may be replaced by new feacing and/or reset to conform to staked property lines. Declarant shall not be responsible for or defend against adverse possession suits based on external boundary survey differences. Feacing along streets, if nay, will be of finished straigh raits or poles, finished wood, wrought fron or masoary construction, or some combination thereof, and shall be extended a minimum of twepty-five (25) feet along side or rear lot lines may from the street, before other fending may be used. Unstripped bark posts and raits shall not be permitted. Fences must be approved in writing by the ACC as to location and materials prior to construction thereof. (See also paragraph 4.A. <u>Setbacks</u> and 21. Anjmale)
- (b) Antennas: Attic antennas inside the house (as opposed to roof antennas) are effective, are less veluerable to damage and are encouraged. Tall or otherwise prominent and virible ameanas are prohibited. Stabilite dish antennas may be used only in ereas where they will be unobtrurive, and shall be painted and screened to blend in with the natural environment they must be approved in writing by the ACC prior to installation. Screening with small trees is effective and minimizes anaturative views from public reads and adjoining lots.
- (13) Lighting: Outdoor lighting will be permitted to the extent it does not create a visual manance to neighboring property (except reasonable landscape lighting that has approval of the ACC). Outdoor lights will be focused. Lighted entry pylon and/or differency lights will be of a type that can be turned on and off by the property owner, and sited so as not to annoy nearby lot owners. Normally such lights shall be turned off when not needed.
- (14) Landscaping: New plantings and growth will be controlled so a not to ancessonably obstruct monatula views from adjoining lots. The ACC is abtorized, but not obligated, to enforce removal, thinning or topping of new view obstructions, and in their sole discretion to determine the validity of any complaints. Remedies of the ACC include all width these concentus for other violations including liens and foreclosure in violations will not cooperate in removing such view obstructions.
- R. Penalty Fee for Violations: Written application for approval of plans shall be made and signed by the owner of the tract (not the builder) and the owner shall be haid responsible for any violations of the covenants which are committed by the builder or other persons engaged by the owner. If any excavation, cotting of trees or construction is commenced by owner, or owner's representatives, prior to receipt of written approval by the ACC, then the owner agrees to pay immediately a penalty of three hundred dollars (\$300) to the enforcement true fined (see paragraph 25.B.), which shall utilize and funds to further enforce the BENT TREE covenants as necessary. Purchasers of tracts in BENT TREB agree to make such payment, and understand that a lien shall be filed against their property if they do not (see paragraph 25.C.). Purther, if legal action is necessary to enforce this covenant, purchasers agree to pay all expenses, to include reasonable legal fees, Incurred by the ACC in collection of said penalty. Payment of said penalty does not preclude further action by the ACC to disapprove such areas in which clearing or construction has begun.
  - 11. CLEARING OF TREES: Approval shall be obtained from

Declarat or subsequently, the ACC, to cut down or clear any trees on any tract, except dead trees, reasonable thinning of trees of four (4) lach diameter or test, or for infestation control. Owners of lots shall dispose of such cleared trees in a way to prevent accumulations of brush, sturings, tresh, or other materials which may constitute a fire hazard or render a tract unsightly, provided, however, that this shall not operate to restrict purchasers from storing fireplace wood in neat stacks on their tracts. Owners are responsible for prompt treatment or removal of trees infected by pine beetle or other inacets which can kill trees within a year and might spread to adjacent trees and lost, and to reasonably contain any trees with slow parisitie growth such as mistletoe. In addition, owners are responsible for controlling and removing weeds declared noxious by governmental authorities and in accordance with El Paso County weed control rules and regulations.

- (a) Widdire Hazard Reduction: All buildings should have a thirty (30) fool defeasible area or 'safety zone' last discretions. All brush within ren (10) feet of the building should be removed and replaced with an irrigated greenbelt (grass, flowers or shrubs) or noncombustible materials, such as rock, brick pavers or gravel. Trees within the thirty (30) foot safety zone should be thinned to eliminate overlapping crowns. Dead limbs should be primed from trees within two tree heights of the building. All branches which extend over or under the caves of the roof should be trimmed. Dead limbs, leaves and grass clippings should be removed from all areas. Firewood should be sucked upbill and at least ten (10) feet from structures. Homes should be equipped with smoke detectors and at least one 2.5 pound fire exinguisher resinualned in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.
- 12. EASEMENTS: Easements for installation, operation and maintenance of utilities, roadways, water lines, drainage facilities and such other purposes as may be designated by Declarant and/or governmental authorities are reserved on, over and under a strip of land fifteen (15) feet wide along all front lot lines, ton (10) feet along all fide and rear lot lines, and twenty (20) feet along all Bent Tree exterior boundaries, and/or as otherwise shown on the recorded plat. If purchaser buys condiguous lots, easements and setbacks shall apply unless the purchaser formally vacates the corn con lot line through the appropriate government agencies. - 13. <u>OBSTRUCTIONS TO VISION AT INTERSECTIONS</u>: No fence, wall, hedge, tree, shrub planting or other structure which unduly obstructs lines-of-sight shall be placed or permitted to remain on any corner formed by the intersections of streets. The ACC shall be the sole and exclusive judge of whether said lines-of-sight are obstructed so as to create a possible safety hazard.
- 14. <u>REDIVISION</u>: Further subdivision of lots in BBNT TREE is not permitted; however, the intent of this covenant is not to preclude mistor lot line adjustments to resolve building hardships, provided that such variations meet all legal requirements lockeding compliance with all zoning and subdivision requirements of Et Paso County, Colorado, and are approved by Declarant and the ACC in writing. If a lot line has been vacated, the affected property may not be again redivided into separate lots without the prior written approval of Declarant, in addition to meeting all of the requirements of any government entities.
- 15. NUISANCE: Nothing shall be done or permitted on any lot which may be or become an annoyance or nuisance to the neighborhood. No accious, noise polluting or otherwise offensive activities or commercial businesses or trades shall be carried on upon any tract. Any extentor lighting on any lot shall either be indirect or of such controlled focus and intensity as not to unduly disturb residents of adjacent or nearby property.

No tralibikes, minibikes, motorcycles, all-terrain vehicles, snow-mobiles, or other such noise causing vehicles shall be operated within BENT TREB other than on County-toods and going to and from residences. No activity shall be permitted which will generate a noise level sufficient to interfere with the transcrible grief enjoyment of the persons on any adjoining or nearby lots.

No hunting of any kind, nor the discharge of fittearms shall be permitted in BENT TREE.

16. REFUSE AND RUBBISH: Rubbish, garbage or other waste shall be kepi and disposed of in a sanitary manner. Containers or other equipment for the storage or disposal of gatbage, trash, rubbish or other refuse shall be kept in a clean, sanitary condition. All garbage or trash containers shall be kept at all times in a closed garage or placed in walled-in areas designed to blend in with the house, so that they shall not be visible from other tracts or from public streets. Borded gas tanks, if any, must be underground, of concealed behind walled-in areas designed to blend in with the bouse, and may be subject to the approval of the Fire Department. No

trash, litter, jork, equipment, boxes or other such items shall be permitted to remain exposed upon the premites and visible from public streets or from other tracts within the stirklivision.

All empty trash, rubbish and garbage containers will be promptly temoved from successide after pick-up by trash hauling companies.

- 17. Signs: All signs ditplayed must be first approved in writing by Declarant or the ACC. This occenant does not preclude the display of customary 18" x 24" brilder or real estate signs. Declarant or ACC reserves the right to make exceptions to size requirements, or to require modification or removal of any signs deemed not in keeping with the area and subdivision decor, however, neither Declarant nor ACC shall require real estate signs to be smaller (and provided herein, and this restriction shall run with the land and may only be changed by Declarant. Declarant, its successors or assigns, reserves the right to erect and maintain an entrance sign on tracts at either side of the street at each entry point into BENT TREE, along with gateways, posts, walls, signs and other structures both to permanently identify BENT TREE and to market it. In addition, Declarant reserves the right to place signs on any lot in the subdivision as Declarant decreas necessary for safety or suffic guidance, and purchasers of tracts in BENT TREE agree thereto.
- 18. <u>DRILLING</u>: No oil dailing, oil development operations, oil refining, quarry or mining operations of any kind shall be permitted on of in any tract, nor shall gas or oil wells, tanks, tunnels, mineral excavations or shafts be permitted upon or in any tract. No derrick or other suncture designated for use in boring for oil or satural gas shall be erected, maintained or permitted upon any tract.
  - CLOTHES DRYING AREA: Exterior clotheslines are prohibited.
- 20. VEHICLE PARKING AND EQUIPMENT: No vehicles shall be stored or parked within the subdivision except in a closed garage; however, recreation vehicles to include travel trailers, horse trailers, campers, boats or a motor home and various equipment may be kept in an organized manner to the rear of a house if not readily visible from public streets not reasonably from other lots within the subdivision. Screening such vehicles from public view with proper garaging, trees, or fencing approved by the ACC, its required. The intent of this covenant is to prevent clutter and enhance natural appearance.

#### 21. UTILITIES:

- A. All utility lines, including service lines of whatsoever kind or outme, shall be underground on all tracts within BENT TREE, excepting that existing poles and lines shall not be removed and placed underground by Declarant. It shall be the responsibility of each owner to extend underground service lines to his house from existing lines or lines which may be provided by Declarant.
- B. The water supply for BENT TREE shall be provided by meens of wells, to be constructed and operated in accordance with the augmentation plan described in paregraph 8 preceding. Each owner shall be responsible for the construction and maintenance of his own well and for the connection of the well to his bouse. No owner may construct a well or initiate any water right at BENT TREE except through a well approved pursuant to the augmentation plin.
- C. Sewer service for BENT TRBE will be provided by means of individual septic tanks and leach fields, to be constructed and maintained by each owner. No systems of the evaporamptration type shall be permitted valess required by the El Past County Health Department or other governmental agency of proper jurisdiction and approved under the water augmentation plan by the authority managing said augmentation plan (Declarant, BTFOA or ACC, as appropriate).

#### 22. ANIMALS:

- A. No animals, poultry or livestock of any kind shall be boused, raised or kept on any tract or property either temporarily or permaneally, except that commonly accepted domestic household pets may be kept provided that they ere not kept or maintained for any commercial purposes.
- B. <u>Doer</u> shall not be permitted to run loose and shall be kept under control of owners at all times. Kennels for the commercial rulning, breeding and boarding of animals are prohibited. Barking dogs are considered a nuisance and owners will act to restrain them.
- C. Fances for animals will be at least five (5) feet high of solid wood or masonry. Colors will be compatible with the main dwelling. Proper maintenance is required. Such feates must be preapproved in writing by the ACC which will be highly sensitive to the ambiance of the neighborhood to include appearance from the streets and adjacent lots. Under no circumstances will dops be allowed to run loose in the neighborhood. The use of electronic pet containment (invisible) featers in lieu of conventional feating is strongly recommended.
  - 23. RIGHT OF DECLARANT: Declarant, its successors or assigns,

expressly reserves the right:

- A. From time to time to amend or revoke any restrictive coverants then he existence, except for those provisions in Paragraph 8 (Water Augmentation Pian Requirements), which provisions shall not be amended or revoked except by Order of the appropriate Water Court, but no such amendment or revocation shall apply to tracts that are sold plor thereto without the whiten courant of a majority of the then cowners of any such tracts (one vota per tract), acr shall amendment or revocation be of such nature as to derogate property values.
- B. To enter into agreements with the purchaser of any lot or odjacent the consent of the purchasers of other lots or adjoining or odjacent property) to deviate from those conditions, restrictions, limitations and agreements herein set forth, and any such deviation which shall be manifested by agreement in writing shall not constitute a waiver of any such condition, restriction, limitation, or agreement as to the remaining lots in said subdivision, and the same shall remain fully enforceable on all other lots formed in the said subdivision by Declarant, its successors or assigns, and the purchasers of other lots except as against the lot where such deviation is permitted.
- C. To modify, change or delote any covenant as it perains to one or more tracts which may prevent obtaining VA or FHA financing except for those provisions in Paragraph 8 (Water Augmentation Plan Requirements), which provisions shall not be amusded or revoked except by Order of the appropriate Water Courts however, any such action will not change the intent of these covenants to establish and maintain a single family readential area of the fighest caliber.
- D. To widen cate in roads beyond the 60' road right-of way to obtain gravel to finish roads and to meet County road grade requirements, and to remove gravel from any unsold lots. Such areas will be graded and restored when no longer needed. After final road approval and acceptance of roads for maintenance by the County, this paragraph, 23.D., shall be null and void and of no further effect.
- E. Declarant shall make conveyances of water rights and responsibilities under the plans for augmentation as more fully described to Paragraph 8.
- 24. TERM OF COVENANTS: These covenants and restrictions are to run with the land and shall remain in full force and effect for twenty-five (25) years from the date these covenants are recorded, after which time said covenants shall be automatically extended for successive periods of ten (10) years unless an instrument signed by a simple majority of the then owerst of the tracts (one vote per tract) has been recorded, changing said covenants in whole or part; however, covenants may be amended at any time by a three-fourthe (3/4) majority vote of all property owners (one vote per tract). Notwithstanding the foregaing, the provisions of Paragraph 8 (Water Augmentation Plan Requirerments) shall notifier tertuloule nor be amended except by Order of the applicable Water Court, which may amend, randiffy or change such provisions by Judicial order. All changes shall be legally drawn and formally recorded in Bl Paso County.

### 25. ENFORCEMENT:

- A. Enforcement shall be by proceedings at law or in equity against any person or persons violating or attempting to violate any cove-nant, either to restrain violation or to recover damages. Coverants are for the use, convenience and protection of all property owners. Declarant, Architectural Control Committee, BTPOA, or any individual lot owner may act to enforce the coverants; some of the foregoing, however, are obligated to do so. Declarant and the Architectural Control Committee, together or separately, or through authorized agents or employees further reserve the right, whi never there shall have been an apparent violation of one or more of the provisions of these covenants and after ten (10) days notice to owner, to enter upon the property where such violation exists and summarily abate or remove the same at the expense of the owner and such entry ly able of remove the same at the expects of the owner are such carry and absterness or removal shall not be deemed a respass. Property owners in BBNT TREE expressly agree to ablde by injunctions without necessity of boad, in order to simplify judicial proceedings to remedy coverant violations. In addition, if a judicial action is necessary to prohibit a coverant of the property of the property of the property of the process of the property o nant violation and a violation is established, the violator(s) shall pay and ngree to pay all costs of the enforcement proceeding, including reasonable attoracys' fees. The failure to enforce any right, reservation, restriction, or condition contained herein, however long continued, shall not be deemed a waiver of the right to do so thereafter as to the same breach or as to a breach occurring prior to or subsequent thereto and shall not bar or affect its calcure ment. The invalidation by any court of any restriction herein contained shall not in any way affect any of the other restrictions but they shall remain in full force and effect.
- 13. <u>Baforoement Trust Fund</u>: Matching fees of fifty dollars (\$50) each shall be paid at closing by the purchaser of each lot and by Dacharant, and said funds shall be kept in a trust fund by Declarant to be used for enforcement of the protective covenants. Any penalties that may, be collected from time to time shall also be placed in said fund (see paragraph 9.ft.). Said fund shall be used by Declarant, its heles, successors and

- assigns, for paying future legal or other expenses involved in enforcing these covenants and said Declarant is bereby authorized to use said fund. In addition, said find or periodors thereof may be transferred into the BTPOA reasons for the perpotes outlined in paragraphs 7, and 8., and may be used at the discretion of Declarant for continuing subdivision expenses no longer the responsibility of the developer, such as maintenance of entrance ways and signs, special mailings, etc; however, the fund shall not be depleted to the extent that insufficient funds are available to enforce the covenants. In like transfer, the BTPOA may transfer BTPOA funds into the Enforcement Trust Fund if needed to enforce ovenents. The ACC and/or any individual tract owner destring to use said fund for the enforcement of these covenants, shall make written request of Declarant for the use of monies in said fund, and Declarant shall have sole authority to approve or day any such request. Denial of such request shall not preclude an individual tract owner from bringing suit to enforce bese covenants under the provisions of paragraph 24.A. above. Fund shall be kept by Declarant to not inverse after all lots have been built upon, or earlier, at the discretion of Declarant, or be numed over to the control of the ACC for the uses provide the results.
- C. LIENS: Non-payment of feet incurted by Declarant and/or ACC in enforcing correction of a bons fide violation of these coveracts or in abalentest or removal as covered herein and per paragraphs 6 and 9,8. hereof, shall result in a recorded lien being placed on the lots add/or lot interest owned by the violator(e), including improvements thereon, said lien to bear interest at eighteen percent (18%) per ansum or two percent (2%) above the prime of the Nurwest Bank of Colorado Springs, N.A., whichever is higher, from the dule filed. Declarant and/or ACC is empowered to file such lien if within thirty (30) days of written notification to owner of amount dee, owner has not made payment in full. Such lien shall run with the land nules said property is repossessed by Declarant, its successors or assigns, in which case the lien shall become null and void and shall be hereby released at that time. Continued failure to pay such liens may result in foreclosure on the entire property in order to enforce payment.
- 26. NOTICES: Any nodes required to be given to any owner or other person under the provisions of these Protective Covenants shall be deemed to have been properly given when malled, post paid, to the last known address of the record owner of the lot in which the member has an interest.
- 27. <u>DECLARANT MAY ASSIGN</u>: Declarant, its soccessors or assigns, may assign any and all of its rights, powers, obligations and pulvileges under this instrument to any other corporation, association, committee or perron.
- 28. EXCLUDED PARCELS: The following percels in Bent Tree Fillings IV and V are excluded from the provisions of these covenants.
- A. TRACT A, Filing IV, as shown on the recorded plat thereof, is reserved for the operation and maintenance of water well, U.D. No. 1-17798P.
- B. TRACT A, Filing V, as shown on the recorded plat theroof, Is reserved for the use of U S West Communications for the Installation, operation and traintenance of tele-communications equipment serving the subdivision.
